

Gospel Reflection ... Reflexion del Evangelio

5 de octubre de 2025
XXVII Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

A lo largo del Evangelio encontramos diferentes pasajes donde Jesús elogia a las personas que tienen fe. Por ejemplo: "Levántate, tu fe te ha salvado" (Lucas 17:19). Un buen reto podría ser darnos a la tarea de leer los cuatro evangelios y tomar nota de estos pasajes, para así poder comparar a las personas de aquel tiempo con nosotros hoy, en lo que respecta a la fe. ¿En qué creemos actualmente? ¿Cómo podemos medir la fe que hay en nosotros? ¿Seguimos a Jesús solo para pedirle favores y que nos haga milagros, o porque de verdad tenemos fe en Él?

El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, en sus números 176 y 184, nos dice lo siguiente sobre la fe: "La fe es una adhesión personal del hombre entero a Dios que se revela. Comprende una adhesión de la inteligencia y de la voluntad a la revelación que Dios ha hecho de sí mismo mediante sus obras y sus palabras". Y añade: "La fe es un gusto anticipado del conocimiento que nos hará bienaventurados en la vida futura". La vida de fe no se construye en solitario. Para su crecimiento, intervienen muchos factores. El primero nos fue dado desde el bautismo, y nuestros padres y abuelos participaron de primera mano en su desarrollo. La comunidad de fe es otro factor esencial. Después, el crecimiento de la fe depende de cada uno. Hoy, hagamos la misma petición que hicieron los apóstoles: "Señor, aumentanos la fe". Seguramente, la respuesta será la misma. ¿Verdad?

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

A priest friend of mine received a call from a family whose elderly mother was dying. Within thirty minutes, he was at her bedside, offering the consolation of the sacraments, anointing her with the oil of the sick, and commending her soul to God. She passed not long after, and for months, her family spoke of their deep gratitude for his presence. When I phoned him to commend his faithful ministry, he simply said, "I was just doing my job."

His words brought to mind Jesus' teaching this week in Luke 17:10: "So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty.'" In a world that often seeks recognition and applause, the Lord invites us into a different mindset — one of humble service. The priest did not see his response as extraordinary; he saw it as a grace to fulfill his vocation.

How tempting it is to seek affirmation for doing what I ought to do! Yet Jesus reminds us that true discipleship is not about grandstanding but about quiet faithfulness. It is enough to have served. It is enough to have loved. It is enough to be grateful that we were given the chance to do our duty in the first place. Whether in priesthood, parenthood, or any vocation, what peace-soaked freedom there is in simply doing what is asked of us. No more, no less. Jesus, that is how you quietly love us.

San Bruno de Colonia | 6 de octubre

Bruno, nacido en 1030, también es conocido como San Bruno el Cartujo por la orden monástica que fundó. Estudió en Reims y fue ordenado en Colonia en 1055. En 1057 regresó a Reims para dirigir la escuela, un puesto que mantuvo durante casi 20 años. Fue nombrado canciller de la iglesia de Reims en 1075, pero se fue poco después en protesta por el comportamiento del nuevo obispo Manasses de Gournai, quien finalmente fue depuesto en 1080. Bruno rechazó la nominación para reemplazar a De Gournai ya que tenía la intención de retirarse a vivir en soledad y oración. Tuvo una visión en un sueño para ir con el obispo (más tarde santo) Hugo de Grenoble. Bruno, Hugh y otros cinco religiosos se establecieron en Chartreuse y fundaron la orden de los cartujos en 1084.


Este primer período de vida monástica no duraría mucho. Bruno fue llamado para ayudar a Urbano II, un antiguo alumno suyo, contra el antipapa Guiberto de Rávena y el hostil emperador del Sacro Imperio Romano Germánico Enrique IV. Mientras trabajaba con Urbano II, rechazó otra oferta para convertirse en obispo, esta vez de Calabria. Finalmente, a Bruno se le permitió regresar a la vida monástica. El conde Roger de Sicilia y Calabria se hace amigo de Bruno y de los monjes de su orden, concediéndoles la tierra donde fundaron Santa María en La Torre. La orden era conocida por su estricto ascetismo, pobreza y oración y su organización única que combinaba la vida del ermitaño con la vida colectiva de los monjes tradicionales.

Saint Bruno of Cologne | October 6

Bruno, born in 1030, is also known as Saint Bruno the Carthusian for the monastic order he founded. He studied in Reims and was ordained in Cologne in 1055. In 1057 he went back to Reims to lead the school, a post he kept for almost 20 years. He was made chancellor of the church of Reims in 1075 but left soon after in protest of the behavior of new bishop Manasses de Gournai who was finally deposed in 1080. Bruno refused the nomination to replace de Gournai as it was his intention to retire to live in solitude and prayer. He had a vision in a dream to go with Bishop (later Saint) Hugh of Grenoble. Bruno, Hugh, and five other religious settled at Chartreuse and founded the Carthusian order in 1084.

This first period of monastic life was not to last long. Bruno was called to help Urban II, a former student of his, against the antipope Guibert of Ravenna and the hostile Holy Roman Emperor Henry IV. While working with Urban II, he rejected another offer to become bishop, this time of Calabria. Eventually Bruno was allowed to return to monastic life. Count Roger of Sicily and Calabria befriended Bruno and the monks of his order, granting them the land where they founded St. Mary's at La Torre. The order was known for its strict asceticism, poverty, and prayer and its unique organization combining the life of the hermit with that of the collective life of traditional monks.

Saint Bruno wrote several commentaries on the psalms and on St. Paul's epistles. He died on October 6, 1101, and was never formally canonized because his order renounces all public honors. However, Pope Leo X gave permission for Carthusians to celebrate his feast in 1514 and his name was added to the Roman calendar in 1623.
