## Virtues, Explained! Temperance

"For the grace of God has appeared bringing salvation to the entire human race...(teaching) us to reject god-less ways and worldly desires," reads Titus 2:11-12, "and in the present age to lead lives that are temperate, just and godly."

This cardinal virtue of temperance is shown in the person who is master of his passions and his attachment to the world. "It ensures the will's mastery over instincts and keeps desires within the limits of what is honorable," we read in the Catechism (CCC 1809).

Temperance is not repression of feeling; it is an exercise of the will, a careful and calculated choice. In this way, temperance actually safeguards virtuous love, keeping it "whole and uncorrupted," said St. Augustine. The practice of temperance is intimately linked to the virtue of chastity, which "protects the intimate center of the person...refusing to unveil what should remain hidden" (CCC 2521).

## Reflexion del Evangelio...Gospel Reflection

19 de abril de 2026  
III Domingo de Pascua

Señor Jesús, haz que comprendamos las Escrituras y enciende nuestro corazón mientras las escuchamos cada domingo en la Eucaristía. Es tu Palabra viva y eficaz la que enciende nuestro corazón, como a los discípulos de Emaús. ¡Qué alegría tan grande tener a Jesús Eucaristía entre nosotros como alimento vivo para el camino! Jesús se acerca discretamente en nuestra vida de cada día; se une a nosotros, nos consuela y nos anima a seguir adelante. No les dijiste al principio quién eras, sino que les explicaste las Escrituras para que ellos mismos te reconocieran. Aunque fue tarde, lo hicieron: te invitaron a su casa, y allí surgió el milagro de reconocerte.

¿Dónde reconoces tú a Jesús en tu vida? ¿En qué etapa de tu historia se ha unido a ti?

Ayúdanos, Jesús, a sentir tu presencia en nuestra vida; que no pases desapercibido, a pesar del ruido y la monotonía del día a día. “Quédate con nosotros, ya está cayendo la tarde y se termina el día. Entró, pues, para quedarse con ellos” (Lucas 24:29). Así de importante es el camino de Emaús, que escuchamos cada tercer Domingo de Pascua. Jesús explica las Escrituras por el camino, no en una sinagoga; se le invita a quedarse en casa porque el día se acaba, y lo más hermoso: parte el pan para todos nosotros. No hay mejor manera de continuar celebrando la Pascua que invitar a Jesús Resucitado a casa, para platicar con Él, contarle lo que nos pasa, las alegrías y las tristezas, por medio de la oración. Para que Él renueve nuestra esperanza y nuestra fe. ¡Feliz Pascua!

3rd Sunday of Easter

When I first read Homer's Odyssey as a teenager, one scene captured my imagination: Odysseus finally returning home after 20 years, yet no one recognized him. Disguised as a beggar, he speaks with his wife, his son, and even his enemies. He is fully present, yet hidden. Only at the right moment does he reveal himself, and everyone realizes he has been with them all along. I was struck by the mystery that he could be so close to his loved ones, and yet they simply could not identify him.

A similar mystery is at the heart of today's Gospel. Two disciples walk the road to Emmaus with Jesus, but “their eyes were prevented from recognizing him.” (Luke 24:16) He listens, teaches, and eats with them, yet they remain blind until he breaks the bread. Suddenly their eyes are opened — and at that very moment, he vanishes. His disappearance is not absence. Rather, it is revelation. The Risen Lord is now present in a new way, in the breaking of the bread and in the life of His Church.

Faith is this shift of vision. Instead of searching for a visible Jesus as if he were absent, we learn to recognize him unveiled in hidden ways — in Scripture proclaimed, in the Eucharist, in the sacraments, in the very life of the Church.

And what is true of him is true of us. Just as he disappears into the mission of his Body, we too are meant to be hidden in him. When we live hidden in Christ, we are seen for who we really are.

**EARTH DAY!** 

San Anselmo | 21 de abril

San Anselmo de Canterbury dejó su hogar en Italia para viajar de joven y acabó en el monasterio de Bec, Francia, conocido por las enseñanzas de su líder, Lanfranc. Anselmo ascendió rápidamente hasta convertirse en abad de la comunidad y sus escritos ahora se comparan en importancia con los de San Agustín.

En 1093 Anselmo fue nombrado arzobispo de Canterbury por Guillermo II Rufo, hijo y sucesor de Guillermo el Conquistador. Sin embargo, en aquella época existía una controversia en Europa sobre si los reyes o el papa tenían el poder de invertir obispos. Anselmo, que creía que solo el papa debía tener derecho a investirse de autoridad eclesiástica, pasó gran parte de su tiempo como arzobispo exiliado en Roma.

La enseñanza y las obras teológicas de San Anselmo son su contribución más importante a la fe católica. Es considerado uno de los padres de la teología escolástica y su principal logro en filosofía fue el argumento ontológico a favor de la existencia de Dios. ¿Su obra Cur Deus homo? enseñó que la expiación de los pecados solo podía lograrse a través de Cristo. Fue canonizado en 1494 y nombrado Doctor de la Iglesia en 1720.

St. Anselm | April 21

St. Anselm of Canterbury left his home in Italy to travel as a young man and ended up at the monastery in Bec, France, which was known for the teachings of its leader, Lanfranc. Anselm rose quickly to become abbot of the community and his writings are now compared in importance to those of St. Augustine.

In 1093 Anselm was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury by William II Rufus, the son and successor of William the Conqueror. However, at the time there was a controversy in Europe over whether kings or the pope had the power to invest bishops. Anselm, who believed only the pope should have the right to invest an ecclesiastical authority, spent much of his time as Archbishop exiled in Rome.

St. Anselm's teaching and works of theology are his most important contribution to the Catholic faith. He is considered of the fathers of scholastic theology and his chief achievement in philosophy was the ontological argument for the existence of God. His work Cur Deus homo? taught that atonement for sins could only be achieved through Christ. He was canonized in 1494 and named a Doctor of the Church in 1720.
