Virtues, Explained! Loyalty

Pope Paul VI, in Ecclesia Suam, considered "loyalty, perseverance and self-sacrifice" to be the distinguishing marks of a Christian in a modern world that increasingly embraces relativism.

"The follower of Christ is not pliant and cowardly, but loyal and strong," he wrote.

The virtue of loyalty is closely linked to the virtue of obedience, wherein we freely submit ourselves to rightful authority. As Catholics, we are called to be loyal to our bishops, to Scripture and Tradition, to the teaching authority of the Church (the Magisterium), and to the Christian way of life.

Loyalty is distinct from admiration for a person or institution, and even from respect. Admiration and respect can be rightfully earned and rightfully lost. Virtuous loyalty does not swerve from its object, and it flows forth from the one who gives it.

Reflexion del Evangelio...Gospel Reflection

17 de mayo de 2026
VII Domingo de Pascua

Jesús ora por el nuevo pueblo de Dios y encomienda al Padre a sus hijos, que se quedarán en el mundo. Nos dice que la vida eterna consiste en conocer al Padre, único Dios verdadero, y en reconocer que Jesús viene de Él. Estas verdades nos ayudan a seguir adelante en medio de las tribulaciones. El sufrimiento existe en el mundo y nunca desaparece, pero está unido a la esperanza de llegar a resucitar como Jesús; alienta el corazón y fortalece la oración: “El mensaje que recibí se lo he entregado, y ellos lo han recibido y reconocen de verdad que yo he salido de ti, y creen que tú me has enviado” (Juan 17:8). Sin duda alguna, el mensaje de Jesús es que experimentemos la vida eterna desde aquí, en la tierra. San Carlo Acutis decía: “La Eucaristía es mi autopista hacia el cielo”. “Cuanto más recibimos la Eucaristía, más nos haremos semejantes a Jesús, de modo que en la tierra tendremos un anticipo del cielo”. ¿Qué piensas tú de esta oración de Jesús a su Padre?

“Jesús reza, pide para que la tristeza y el aislamiento no nos ganen el corazón. Nosotros queremos hacer lo mismo: queremos unirnos a la oración de Jesús, a sus palabras, para decir juntos: ‘Padre santo, cuídalos con el poder de tu nombre... para que estén completamente unidos, como tú y yo’, y que ‘su gozo sea completo’. Jesús reza y nos invita a rezar, porque sabe que hay cosas que solo podemos recibir como don; hay cosas que solo podemos vivir como regalo”. Not long after my brother’s first child was born, a beautiful little girl named Mary Elise, I asked him what it was like. Was he nervous? Overwhelmed? He said, “When I first held her, I was in such shock. I think I just said, ‘I am your dad. I am your dad.’” That moment marked a deep transformation for him. He was not just holding a baby; he was stepping into a new identity. Over the years, I have seen him live his fatherhood with quiet sacrifice, joy, and faithfulness. It started with that moment of truth.

This, I propose, is a glimpse of what Jesus means when he prays, “Consecrate them in the truth.” (John 17:17) To be consecrated is to be set apart in love, not taken out of the world. Consecration sends us into it with a new identity, always one that binds us to him and to others in love. Our bond to Jesus and others is the deep truth that he continually renews.

Whenever we speak deep truths about ourselves, we experience this renewal: “I have sinned;” “I need help;” “I forgive you;” “I take you as my husband;” “I believe in one God...” Whether in confession, in the liturgy, or in a recovery group, truth heals and transforms.

And the deepest truth of all? That we belong to the Risen and Ascended Christ. Our lives are no longer just ours. We are his and he is ours.

Name one truth you need to step into more deeply, about yourself, someone else, or God. Maybe put it on a note on your mirror. Let that truth consecrate you this week.

St. Rita of Cascia | May 22

St. Rita of Cascia (1381 – 1457) had the opportunity to live her life as a wife, mother, widow, and eventually, member of a religious community. Born in central Italy, St. Rita felt the calling to become a nun, but was pressured at a young age into marriage. During her 18-year marriage to a cruel man, she raised two sons. When her husband was killed in a brawl and her sons died, St. Rita decided to go back to her first love and attempted to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Her status as a widow caused some complications to her entering, but she eventually succeeded in professing vows.

Throughout her lifetime, St. Rita of Cascia was known for her prayerfulness and charity. She also experienced stigmata on her forehead, meditated frequently on Christ’s passion, and cared for the nuns of her religious community and those in the lay community who came to her for counsel.



Santa Rita de Cascia | 22 de mayo

Santa Rita de Cascia (1381 – 1457) tuvo la oportunidad de vivir su vida como esposa, madre, viuda y, finalmente, miembro de una comunidad religiosa. Nacida en el centro de Italia, Santa Rita sintió la vocación de convertirse en monja, pero fue presionada desde joven para casarse. Durante sus 18 años de matrimonio con un hombre cruel, crió a dos hijos. Cuando su marido murió en una pelea y sus hijos murieron, Santa Rita decidió volver a su primer amor e intentó unirse a las monjas agustinas en Cascia. Su condición de viuda causó algunas complicaciones para su entrada, pero finalmente logró profesar votos.

A lo largo de su vida, Santa Rita de Cascia fue conocida por su oración y caridad. También experimentó estigmas en la frente, meditó con frecuencia sobre la pasión de Cristo y cuidó de las monjas de su comunidad religiosa y de aquellos laicos que acudían a ella en busca de consejo.
