Reflexion del Evangelio...Gospel Reflection

13 de septiembre de 2026
XXIV Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Creo que en algún momento de nuestra vida hemos sido traicionados y también hemos traicionado. Por lo tanto, todos hemos luchado por perdonar y por ser perdonados. La Palabra de Dios, este domingo, nos invita a experimentar el amor misericordioso de Dios por medio del perdón. Para habitar en su Reino no debemos guardar rencor alguno; por el contrario, el corazón debe estar abierto al perdón. El Papa León XIV, en sus catequesis sobre el perdón, nos dice lo siguiente: “Ha comprendido que la libertad del otro, incluso cuando se extravía en el mal, todavía puede alcanzarse con la luz de un gesto manso. Porque sabe que el verdadero perdón no espera el arrepentimiento, sino que se ofrece primero, como un don gratuito, incluso antes de ser acogido”. Así, de esta manera, se manifiesta el amor de Dios a cada persona.

“Comprender la misericordia de Dios es un misterio; pero el misterio más grande y más bello es el corazón de Dios. Si quieres ir directo al corazón de Dios, toma el camino de la misericordia y déjate tratar con misericordia” (Papa Francisco, 21-09-2018). Esto significa que el perdón del cristiano debe asemejarse al perdón que Dios nos concede. ¿A quién debo perdonar? ¿De qué debo ser perdonado en mi familia? Señor, sana mis heridas; son muchas y a veces amargan mi alma, pero con tu ayuda sanarán, y así podré ofrecer a otros el mismo perdón.

¡Amabilidad, Explicada!

El mundo moderno que todos debemos compartir parece, en cierto modo, estar encogiéndose.

Para bien o para mal, gracias al internet, el uso generalizado de las redes sociales y la omnipresencia de los smartphones, nos encontramos interactuando con frecuencia con personas que viven, actúan y piensan de forma diferente a nosotros.

Puede que la virtud de la amabilidad, conocida oficialmente como afabilidad, sea más importante que nunca.

De hecho, estando tan apegada a la virtud de la justicia, la amabilidad es una deuda que debemos a nuestros semejantes, escribe Santo Tomás de Aquino (Sum., II:II, 114, Art. 2). La realidad es que no podemos evangelizar sin bondad. Esto lo vemos en las instrucciones que Cristo da a sus discípulos en el Evangelio de Mateo: “Al entrar en la casa, salúdenla invocando la paz sobre ella. Si esa casa lo merece, que la paz descienda sobre ella; pero si es indigna, que esa paz vuelva a ustedes.” (Mateo 10:13)

Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In my parish, there was once a new employee who frequently told me she was sorry for various imperfections in her work. It could be a little tiring. I finally told her, “You know, you don’t have to say ‘sorry’ so often.” She looked me right in the eyes and said, “Father, you’re right. I’m sorry.” Her ear-to-ear grin betrayed that she enjoyed the irony — and that she would keep asking for forgiveness as often as she needed it.

The Gospel reading this week proclaims to us that God, in Jesus, delights in numerous requests for, and the granting of, forgiveness. To Peter’s question, “Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?” Jesus responds, “I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times.” In other words, Peter, stop counting.

Christian life should be marked by a commitment to frequent forgiveness. God never tires of forgiving us. His limitless love has overcome the power of vengeance, hatred, and division. We tap into that each and every time we ask for forgiveness or extend it to another.

How beautiful our hearts become when they become accustomed to frequent forgiveness! How joyful and attractive become our marriages, families, and parish communities! How light our souls feel when unburdened by the habit of keeping score.

Challenge: Name one thing, small or large, for which you could ask forgiveness from someone in your life. Then do it. -Father John Muir

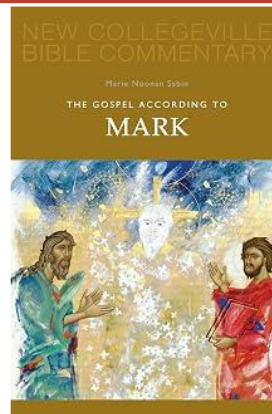
It may well be that the virtue of friendliness, known officially as affability, is more important than ever.

In fact, being attached as it is to the virtue of justice, friendliness is a debt we owe our fellow human beings, writes St. Thomas Aquinas (Sum., II:II, 114, Art. 2). The fact is, we cannot evangelize without kindness. We can see this in the instructions Christ gives his disciples in the Gospel of Matthew: “As you enter a house, wish it peace. If the house is worthy, let your peace come upon it; if not, let your peace return to you.” (Matthew 10:13)

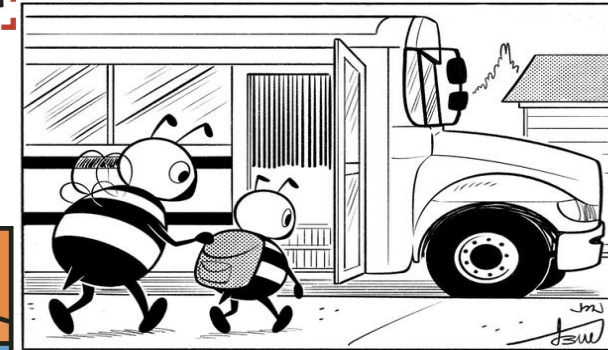
